

Much of the painting exhibited today is a synthesis, segmental, apocopated, non-referential, supposedly conceptual. It is not easy to see a landscape exhibition, because it has been relegated, stigmatized, less precious, as something old, obsolete, reactionary.

Tierra callada is a magnificent example of a landscape by Alberto Pina (Athens, 1971). It doesn't matter if it is natural or invented, the landscape here is a transcript of the painter's soul; a hanger to hang his nakedness, his isolation, his feeling, his metaphysical meditation. More land than sky, without characters, without deterrents: the humanized solitude that Marguerite Duras urged.



The group show exhibition presented by El Quadern Robat gathers different photographic visions on the same subject: the forest, or being in the forest. The six authors that participate in the show belong to the same generation (born between 1969 and 1975) and their proposals deviate from the common places of the chosen genre, which is the landscape. The photographs of Israel Ariño from the series Obirar, in black and white, find in the darkness its



main expressive element. In the gloomy or nocturnal forest explored by Ariño, vegetal traces are drawn and there are different degrees of shadow or blackness. Jordi Casañas evokes, in his image of a bird feather, the flight, its fall and its possible oblivion. Bernat Gasull -son and grandson of

Bonhams is acquired

The British tradition of auction houses is not limited to what we usually call the two big ones, Christie's and Sotheby's, but there is a string of good firms that work not only in the fine art market but also in many other disciplines such as books, silver, carpets, weapons, maps, costumes, ceramics, coins and a long etcetera so there is a cultured collecting. devoted and very attentive to what is appearing. Bonhams is one of the most important. Founded in London in 1793, he worked in more than 60 disciplines, especially fine arts, antiques, automobiles and

jewelry. In 2013 they opened a beautiful headquarters on New Bond Street, a modern building that even houses a Michelin-starred restaurant. With venues in New York, Los Angeles and Hong Kong, and more than 22 representations around the world, they are an international reference. According to their own data, in 2017 they sold about 50,000 lots and had of more than 450 million pounds.

This week they announced that it has been acquired by the UK-based private equity fund Epiris Fund II. Already in 2014 a sale to Poly Culture, one of the Chinese auction giants, was thwarted and they had been trying to find an investor for months. Although neither the price nor the financial conditions have been disclosed, its CEO, Matthew Girling, has stated that "we are happy to have found a buyer who recognizes the potential offered by this business". The art market has significant barriers to entry but also a structural growth that goes back centuries. Auctions globally account for half of a market that is currently in full expansion, but we will have to see what happens in the coming years and how they make this investment profitable in such a competitive environment. The key question is whether they will have the investment capacity and ambition to fight the big two.

The purchase occurs at a time of market expansion
