In 1977, the creator enveloped Joan Prats gallery, Gasull had to take photos of the process and had the opportunity to immortalize the artist.




JORGE OTEIZA

JOAN MIRÓ


A young Gasull and a difficult assignment: to portray the artist without importuning him. He succeeded and was rewarded: a book dedicated to 'the Boy who took photos."






JOAN PONÇ

funniest figures in art.


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PEREJAUME Perejaume was not yet Perejaume, but Gasull itself was already Gasull, The photographer caught the artist's work for the first time.
